WHEREAS, pursuant to a resolution of the Board of Education of Susquehanna Valley Central School District, County of Broome, New York, duly adopted on November 19, 2014, the Special Meeting was duly called and held on February 10, 2015, for the purpose of voting on one proposition as set forth in the Notice calling the Special Meeting;

Information – Mr. Doig reported that he and Mr. Schuldt met with Bearsch Compeau Knudson regarding the Capital Improvement Project. There is a hold up at SED in approving the engineering for the project. SV has been able to break the work out into Phase I and Phase II, breaking out the architectural and engineering so that only a portion of the project is held up for review with the rest moving forward. This is better than most school districts, whose projects are also held up at SED. Mr. Schuldt stated that the review for the work at Brookside is near approval. Mr. Doig stated that it has been a very busy couple of weeks and wanted to thank the administrators, teachers, and everyone for their support.

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT - Dr. Stalma spoke regarding the Legislative Breakfast.

BOARD OF EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT REPORT – Mrs. Vimislik reported out on the Health Insurance Consortium meeting that she attended with Mr. Doig and Mr. Berry, where they set the rates for the next school year.

VOICE OF THE ADMINISTRATORS – Denise Wickham reported that the winter sports were into the post season. Ian Lupole broke the current school record for wrestling and will be going to the state competition with several other wrestlers placing in sectionals. Bowling placed third, and the indoor track team had 13 state qualifiers. The boys and girls basketball teams have qualified for scholar athlete team status.

Kathy Hattala welcomed Mr. Doig as the new superintendent. She announced that the Drama Club play will be the Wizard of Oz and welcomed everyone to attend March 20 through March 22.

Mary Haskell announced that the 2014-15 valedictorian is Julia Allen and the salutatorian is Carly Hattala.

Norm Cline spoke on behalf of the department chairpersons welcoming Mr. Doig to the superintendency.

Mr. Schuldt stated that because of the way the capital project work was broken down between the engineering and architecture, there would not be significant cost to the district in the delay of the review process at SED. He announced that spring sports would begin on March 2. He thanked the Brookside PTA and Natalie Brubaker for their work in acquiring the new playground equipment.
