**FINANCIAL REPORT** – Mr. Bell made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Vimislik, that the Board acknowledges receipt of the August financial reports. Upon vote the motion was approved unanimously. (7 yeses)

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT -

**Report – Financial Audit** – Mr. Daniel Shoen and Mr. Evan Cleveland, Insero & Co. CPA's, LLP, reviewed the 2018-19 External Audit Report and stated they were providing an unmodified opinion on the financial statements of the district and the district's internal control and compliance of regulations. They identified no instances of noncompliance and no material internal control weaknesses in both of these categories. Mr. Shoen stated that the district looked very good financially.

**Liberty Partnership Presentation** –Tracy Parker, representative of the Liberty Partnership with Susquehanna Valley for 16 years, spoke on behalf of the program. This past summer with the help of the district and the Town of Conklin, they held the 3<sup>rd</sup> Conklin Summer Fun Camp held this year on the SV secondary campus. Ms. Parker's students in the Liberty Partnership program are the counselors for the camp, and are paid through the BOCES Summer Youth Employment Program. Ms. Parker explained that they have 100 students attend the camp. Each student receives a breakfast and lunch for the day, which is also open for all students within the district under 18 years of age.

Mr. Doig announced that tonight was the very first Federation Broadcast of a sporting event at Susquehanna Valley. All sports held on the multi-purpose field or in the High School gymnasium will now be broadcast. He stated that this is a very exciting time for SV sports.

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT – Mrs. Brubaker reported that school was off to a fast and furious start, and the mentoring programs was going strong. She stated that they have been looking at some data and continuing our focus on collaboration. She said they are also continuing to look at our regional and district data from the 3-8 assessments and Regents exams. She displayed the data that the Professional Development Committee Team looks at and explained how they use this data for future professional development.

**BOARD OF EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT REPORT** – Mrs. Haskell reminded the board that homecoming will take place on October 25. Also, Mr. Doig announced that Susquehanna Valley will be hosting the Joint Dinner Meeting on January 22.

**VOICE OF THE ADMINISTRATORS** – Mrs. Rich reported a very smooth opening to school especially with the amount of work the teachers had unpacking boxes and setting up their rooms the first two days. She gave a huge thanks to Mr. Schuldt and his crew for their hard work in making this go smoothly. She said they held their Pre K, BK and Kindergarten Orientation, which was very well attended with only one family missing. She thanked the PTA for providing lunch for all those kids those two days. She announced that Curriculum Night will be held on 9/25, and stated that Donnelly is putting a team together for the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk on 10/20.

Ms. Rich spoke on behalf of Mr. Snyder: RTS kicked off the school year well with the building looking good with the smaller construction projects completed this summer. He gave a special thanks to Mr. Schuldt and his staff for their hard work. The first Tuesday was the Sixth Grade Orientation with 102 students out of 111 attending. A special thanks to Mr. Swartwout, the guidance counselors and all sixth grade teachers and special education teachers for their work on this. He stated they already had their Genius Hour kickoff event, Curriculum Night and school pictures. Coming up soon is Junior Honor Society Induction, sixth grade mini dance and Student Council Spirit Meeting.

Mr. Schuldt reported that Phase II of the Capital Project work is 99 percent wrapped up, with things going very smoothly this summer. He said that the teachers were great and very patient in working with his staff to get the classrooms set back up. He gave a big thanks to Tim Weber and Ethan Gardner, C & S construction managers, for their hard work this summer and keeping things running smoothly. He also thanked his staff for their hard work getting the schools ready for students and staff. He mentioned that they did recently meet about next year's Smart Schools project with the vestibules and security camera installations.

Mr. Hutchinson stated that the start of school and the transition of his position has been very smooth thanks to the students and staff. He said that they had the Ninth Grade Orientation in late August with 90 out of 102 students and families here. The High School currently has 139 out of a possible 315 students who are taking credit bearing courses from SUNY; that's 44 percent, the highest ever. He said that Curriculum Night was last Wednesday and they are looking to make some changes with that next year. He reported that Mr. Swartwout awarded him with a plaque; 22 out of 24 of the varsity teams last year had an 85 grade average or higher.
