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SUSQUEHANNA VALLEY CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT RULES, REGULATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS/STUDENT TRIPS

The following procedures, rules and regulations are in effect for all student trips sponsored by the Susquehanna Valley School District. A "sponsored trip" is one approved by the appropriate district official and may be a field trip, an extracurricular trip, or another type of school trip.

All students will be required to present a form signed by the parent or guardian and the student attesting to the fact that the rules are understood and will be followed. Additional information may be attached as developed for a particular trip.

EXPECTATIONS OF STUDENTS:

- 1) Students will conduct themselves in accordance with the student Code of Conduct at all times.
- 2) The use of alcohol, drugs, vape pens or devices and tobacco, in any form, is strictly prohibited.
- Littering on school buses or at the trip destination is prohibited.
- 4) Destruction or vandalism of school or any other public or private property is prohibited.
- 5) Inappropriate displays of affection are prohibited.
- 6) Obscene or lewd gestures, language, or other improper acts are prohibited.
- Students with previous problems with attendance, insubordination, use of alcohol, drugs, vape pens or devices, or tobacco, in any form, may be denied participation on any trip.
- The chaperones are in a position of authority at all times. Students will comply with all directions and reasonable requests of the chaperones.
- 9) The chaperone in charge has the right to terminate the trip at any time. Serious violations may be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency or school authorities for immediate action.
- It is the responsibility of the student and parents/guardians to notify the chaperones of any known medical problem that would have to be considered on the trip.
- 11) It is understood that in the event of serious illness or accident the nearest medical facility will be used.

EXPECTATIONS OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

- 1) Review the accepted rules of conduct and behavior with your child(ren).
- 2) Be sure that school representatives are informed if your child has an allergy other medical needs.
- 3) Be sure that your child does not bring alcohol, drugs, vape pens or devices, or tobacco, in any form, on the trip.

- <u>SV Dollars for Scholars</u> this application typically opens up Semester 2 and students will work on it during English class. Copies of students' transcripts will be provided to the English teachers prior to the start of applications.

Financial Aid

New York State requires that each school district shall ensure verification from the parent or guardian of a student who is a senior that the student either: (1) completed the free application for federal student aid (FAFSA) or, if applicable the Jose Peralta New York State

Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors (DREAM) Act application; or (2) completed a Waiver indicating that the parent or guardian (or student, as applicable), understands what the

FAFSA or, if applicable, the DREAM Act application are, and has chosen not to file an such application. Students that choose not to complete the FAFSA must fill out a waiver form. Waiver forms can be found in the guidance office.

Counselors and Shaunte Middleton, a counselor with Binghamton University's Talent Search, are available to help families with this process! SUNY Broome is also holding a "Financial Aid Day" on February 8 from 9:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. This event is designed to help students and families with the financial aid application, types of aid available, and the award process. SAT and ACT

There is still time for college-bound seniors to take the SAT or ACT. While some schools have a test-optional policy, there are schools and programs that require SAT or ACT scores. Both exams have fall test dates!







Saber Stage Announces The Cast of Hadestown Teen Version

Hadestown is a musical that retells the ancient Greek myth of Orpheus and Eurydice written by Anaïs Mitchell wrote the music, lyrics, and book for Hadestown. The musical is set in the depression era, in a New Orleans-inspired meeting house. It's infused with blues, jazz, Dixieland, and modern American folk music. IN 2019, It received 14 nominations (the most that year) and won eight, including **Best Musical** and **Best Original Score.**

Hermes, played by Lillian Short, steers the production and the story of young couple, *Orpheus* (Grey Milligan) and *Eurydice* (Janeva Mazil), whose love story takes place in a reimagined underworld. Representing the Greek chorus, the three *Fates* (Ryleigh Stewart, Maddie Zitzmann, and Grayden Everson) give foreboding advice to the young couple. Despite the warnings, *Eurydice* accepts a job in Hadestown, an underground factory, run by *Hades* (Rylan Everson) and his wife *Persephone* (Peyton Tobler). *Eurydice* goes "way down under" to escape poverty. *Orpheus*, a singer-songwriter, sets out to rescue her. The musical explores themes such as doubt, faith, love, fear, and industry versus nature. It also tells a story about the working class's potential to overthrow the ruling class. The workers are led by Alexandria Stewart, Madison Turner, and Basil Kutalek. The rest of the ensemble is played by Lily Hollenbeck, Paul Howard, Hailey Litster, Reilly Miller, and Sophia Sousouris. They are joined by eighth-grade students: Ruby McEwen, Shaina Onishea, Riley Olds, Sophia Landers, Jenna Hogue, Hailey Gorton, and Isaiah Wdowiak.

Our stage crew includes: Ava Palmer, Demetrius Morelock, Victor Piester, Sonora Grant, Jonathan Dieppa, Samantha Gale, Jatiana Field, and Jeane Fazzi.

Stage direction is by Shirley Goodman. Our musical director, pit conductor, and producer is Jenn Perkins. Sonny Dewitt, Karen Everson, and Shirley Goodman will be building the sets designed by Mr. Dewitt. Peg Collins is getting the backstage crew in shape as stage manager. Costumes are assembled and organized by Erin Goodman and Megan Howland. Finally, Hannah Merrell is sharing her dramatic talents as assistant director, and Nina Varano is teaching choreography. Light design is by Shirley Goodman with the assistance of Gabby Button, Terri Schneider, and Rita Foran at the light board running cues.


