Scholarships

Scholarship availability picks up between January and May. Students will want to check several places for a list of scholarships:

- Class of 2024 Google Classroom Under Classwork, Scholarships!
- Scholarship list.
- Guidance Services page on the SV website- Financial Aid section- scholarship link on the right-hand side.
- <u>SV Dollars for Scholars</u> this application typically opens up Semester 2 and students will work on it during English class. English teachers were provided copies of student transcripts before the start of applications.

Junior Parent Night



SAT and ACT

The SAT and ACT are both standardized tests that colleges use to measure academic achievements and college readiness in applicants. Schools accept either the SAT or ACT so students should find out about both tests to determine which one would be best for them to take. Counselors are available to help students decide.

*Please note: SV is not a testing site, so students will have to take the exam at a neighboring high school such as Binghamton HS, Vestal HS, Maine-Endwell HS or CVHS.

Preparing for the SAT/ACT:

Students should familiarize themselves with the test(s) and create a study plan. Here are some tips on how to prepare for the SAT/ACT:

It is recommended that college bound students take the SAT for the first time in the spring of your junior year and again in the Fall before college application deadlines. Most students who retake the SAT raise their score, and some students even take it more than twice.



You are eligible to use the van for breast screening if:


- You are age 40 or older.

SV FACS

Susquehanna Valley High School Family & Consumer Sciences (FACS) classes are busy preparing for Spring and 2024 FACS Service Learning Projects. The curriculum for each elective offered through FACS incorporates mini-service learning projects that focus on creating healthy environments conducive to production, increasing accessibility, food preparation, and sampling of nutrient-dense foods through agricultural and culinary experiences. These projects are designed to be student-driven comprehensive learning opportunities empowering self-efficacy through applications of the principles of sustainable food systems and healthy living through an agricultural lens. The interdisciplinary approach of these projects facilitates the development of critical thinking, problem-solving, and leadership skills.

Healthy food is a key component to increase vitality and longevity. The secret to healthy food lies in the quality of the soil it is grown in. The better the soil, the higher the nutrient density of the food. This was envisioned by SV Alumni, Kolton Gardener (Class of 2022) when he proposed vermiculture as an addition to our FACS program. Fast forward to 2024 and Susquehanna Valley is now vermicomposting through our partnership with Cornell Cooperative Extension.

March 6 and 7, CCE Recycling and Composting Educator, Kira Hawkins joined our classes sharing her knowledge and experience with building healthy soil and raising red wiggler worms to produce worm castings that will enrich our garden soil. With Kira's guidance, students created mini habitats using shredded paper and fruit/vegetable scraps from our culinary classes and composting efforts. Presently, our red wigglers are thriving under the care of our students. We are looking forward to adding worm castings to our courtyard garden beds as soon as the weather permits.




