2024 SAT Prep Classes at SV High School*

The 6-week SAT Prep Class will start Wed March 13 and run until Wed, April 24, in advance of the May 4, 2024 SAT exam. Week # 7 (May 1st) may be offered as an optional opportunity if a prior class was missed (please clear with the teacher). SAT and ACT

The SAT and ACT are both standardized tests that colleges use to measure academic achievements and college readiness in applicants. Schools accept either the SAT or ACT so students should find out about both tests to determine which one would be best for them to take. Counselors are available to help students decide.

*Please note: SV is not a testing site, so students will have to take the exam at a neighboring high school such as Binghamton HS, Vestal HS, Maine-Endwell HS or CVHS.

It is recommended that college bound students take the SAT for the first time in the spring of your junior year and again in the Fall before college application deadlines. Most students who retake the SAT raise their score, and some students even take it more than twice.








The Virginia Trip packet is available by clicking here. Please read the information carefully if you are traveling with us, and note the deadlines for the completed forms.


Students will perform in our trip T-shirt. Trip orders are due by 3/5/24.

Scholarships & Summer Music Programs


