Financial Aid Night

The guidance department will be offering a Financial Aid Night for Seniors and their families on October 23 **at 6:00 p.m.** in the high school auditorium. Part of the college application process is to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and Tuition Assistance Program (Tuition Assistance Program, if attending a NYS school). This presentation will help students and families understand the types of financial aid available and how to submit the application. We highly encourage college-bound students to attend with their families.

Additionally, Shante Middleton (from Talent Search) continues to be available at SVHS from 9:45 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on alternating Wednesdays to provide individualized assistance in completing the FAFSA and TAP applications. We continue to schedule college bound students to meet with her, and welcome parents participation. Please call the Counseling Office at 607-775-9115 if you'd like to make an appointment.



As previously published - the ASVAB will be given to all 10th grade students and some registered Jr/Sr students on November 8, 2024 at 8:00 a.m. This aptitude test helps your child see how interests, abilities, and personal preferences match career opportunities. When taken in the 10th grade there is NO commitment to the military, it is strictly used as a career development tool and will aid in guiding student decisions regarding post high school plans. It is a self-paced test that usually takes students an hour and a half to complete, however students are allotted two and a half hours if needed. Please assure your child arrives at school with a fully charged Chromebook (as they should every day).

SAT and ACT

There is still time for college-bound seniors to take the SAT or ACT. While some schools have a test-optional policy, there are schools and programs that require SAT or ACT scores. Both exams have fall test dates!

If you are still interested in taking the SAT/ACT, you must register online at www.collegeboard.org for the SAT or www.actstudent.org for the ACT. SV is not a testing site, but our students can test at local high schools in the area such as Binghamton HS, Vestal HS or Maine-Endwell HS.



Juniors and Seniors! The Greater Binghamton College Day will be held on Wednesday, October 16. Our students will be bussed to the Visions Veterans Memorial Arena to meet with representatives. There will be over 60 colleges, plus labor unions, financial institutions and military services represented.

Students that would like to attend during the day must turn in a permission slip by **Wednesday, October 9** to assure we have appropriate bussing. **Permission slips were posted in September's newsletter and are available in the Guidance Office.**



Senior Information:

- College-bound should have a list of colleges they plan to apply to,
- Work-bound should bring a list of jobs they are interested in and
- Military-bound should let us know what branch they are interested in. They should also take the ASVAB on November 8, 2024!

Your counselor will help finalize these lists and assist with the application process.

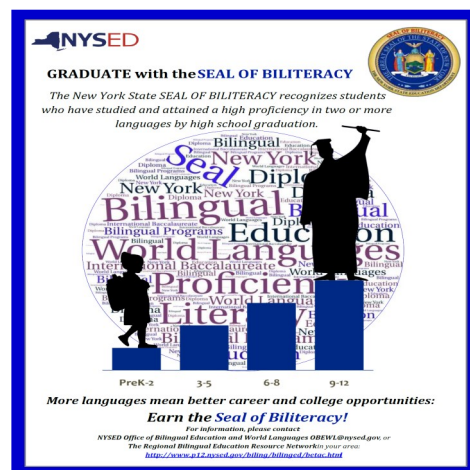


Instant Admit Day

- **One Thanksgiving basket will be provided per household. Please have information on hand for every person within the household prior to making the 211 call.**

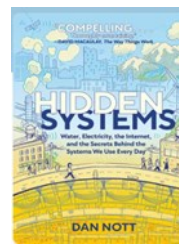
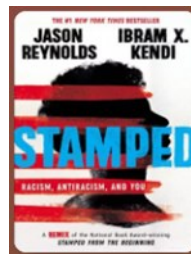
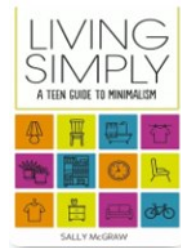
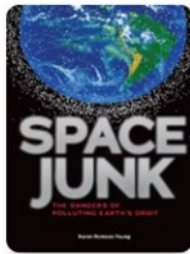


Encourage Your Child to Read Challenging Nonfiction.

In order to be college and career-ready, today's students need to be able to read complicated texts. It is not only the college-bound who need to be highly proficient at reading; employers and the military are also looking for people who can read and understand occupational handbooks, technical manuals, and training/field guides.

One way to increase your Child's reading skills is to encourage them to read nonfiction for fun. Nonfiction books are typically written at a higher Lexile (reading) level than novels and challenge your teen to learn new concepts and specialized vocabulary. Teens should not give up reading literature, which also has many benefits for students such as increasing vocabulary and empathy, but ideally they should read a mix of fiction and nonfiction. While much of the nonfiction collection of books is currently packed until the library renovation is complete, there are many nonfiction eBooks available in our and BT BOCES Sora accounts. Encourage your teen to stop by library cart during lunch and I will help them find nonfiction that interests them.

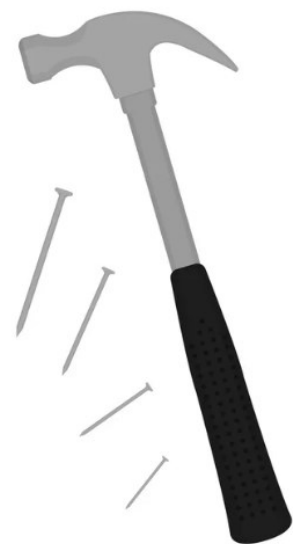



Senior Photos and Grad Ads for the Yearbook

Please be advised of the following important dates regarding your child's senior year deadlines for Yearbook submissions:

Senior Portraits

Schedule your **senior portrait** to ensure proper delivery to the school. Senior portraits are **due Friday, December 6**. Failure to meet this deadline may result in an absence of a senior portrait. Picture days were September 19-20 at the high school. If you were unable to schedule a senior portrait, or attend these days, November 6, (our retake day) is an opportunity to get a senior photo. Seniors need to get their photo taken on these dates to receive an ID card. No costumes or props will be allowed for photos.

Portrait Requirements

Senior Portraits must be submitted electronically (CD, email jpeg, USB). The digital image must be a resolution of 300 dpi and the color mode must be RGB. The image should be sized to a 5x7 image to ensure proper clarity. The yearbook is an all-color book so please plan accordingly when choosing a photo for the yearbook. To maintain a consistent look, only head and shoulders will be in the yearbook photo. No costumes or props will be allowed for photos. Photos submitted should be in color and with a simple background. The SVHS yearbook reserves the right to refuse a photo not meeting specifications.

Senior portraits are due Friday, December 6.

All electronic submissions are to be sent to Mr. Dana Zietz at dzietz@svsabers.org. If submitting in person, please see Mr. Zietz in room 22 in the High School. Any picture received after the due dates listed are not guaranteed to be in the yearbook. It is the student's responsibility to check with their studio to see if the studio has submitted the senior portrait to Susquehanna Valley. Portraits from Sean Murphy Studios will automatically be sent to the school.

For the 2024-2025 school year, our yearbook photo contract is with Sean Murphy Studios. They offer free yearbook sessions in their Binghamton studio for all Susquehanna Valley seniors. Sean Murphy Studios also offers full senior sessions which include the sitting and a selection of prints or digital images starting at only \$100. Many of their senior portrait collections include multi-location sessions with custom photoshop graphics, personal smartphone apps, and some even include 50 free prints!
