News from the Guidance Office October 2023

PSAT:

Susquehanna Valley High School will be offering the Digital PSAT/NMSQT on Wednesday, October 11, to tenth and eleventh graders who have already registered for it. The Digital PSAT is essentially a practice Digital SAT that will help students prepare for the actual Digital SAT, usually taken in May or June of their junior year. The Digital PSAT also has a scholarship opportunity attached to it. Only 11th graders with qualifying scores on the Digital PSAT will be entered into the scholarship competition. Students will use their chromebooks to take the test digitally. Students are not officially registered until payment is received. Due to the digital nature of the exam, students that register after the deadline may not be able to test.

Sections and Timing of the *Digital PSAT*:

Reading and Writing Section- 64 minutes (two modules within the section)

Math Test - 70 minutes (two modules within the section)

Benefits of the Digital PSAT:

- Preparation for the *Digital SAT*
- You can get a sense of your SAT score

- Free, personalized study plans through Khan Academy
- Scholarship opportunity (NMSQT)

The ASVAB will be given on Nov 1, 2023 at 8:00 a.m. to all 10th grade students. This aptitude test helps your child see how interests, abilities, and personal preferences match career opportunities. When taken in the 10th grade there is NO commitment to the military, it is strictly used as a career development tool and will aid in guiding student decisions regarding post high school plans. The test takes 3 hours and 15 minutes to complete online. Please assure your student arrives at school with a fully charged Chromebook (as they should everyday).



Financial Aid Night

The guidance department will be offering an IN-PERSON Financial Aid Night for Seniors and their families on November 29 **at 6:00 p.m.** in the high school auditorium. Part of the college application process is to submit the <u>Free</u> Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This presentation will help students and families understand the types of financial aid available and how to submit the application. We highly encourage college-bound students to attend with their families.

Additionally, Shante Middleton (from Talent Search) is going to be available at SVHS from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on alternating Wednesdays beginning Oct 4 to provide individualized assistance in completing the FAFSA and TAP applications. We will be scheduling college bound students to meet with her, and welcome parents participation.



Juniors and Seniors! The Greater Binghamton College Day will be held on Wednesday, October 18. Our students will be bussed to the Visions Veterans Memorial Arena to meet with representatives from 12:00 p.m. -1:00 p.m. There will be over 60 colleges, plus labor unions, financial institutions and military services represented.

Students that would like to attend during the day must turn in a permission slip by Wednesday, October 11, to assure we have appropriate bussing. Permission slips were posted in September's newsletter and are available in the Guidance Office.

Interested Parents are encouraged to attend the evening session from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. The event is free so plan to come early to get a parking space.

IT'S REAL: TEENS AND MENTAL HEALTH




High School Homecoming Dance



After ending isolation, wear your mask through day 10

Take 2 antigen tests, 48 hours apart

If both tests are negative, you may remove your mask sooner than day 10





Senior Photos and Grad Ads for the Yearbook

Please be advised of the following important dates regarding your child's senior year deadlines for Yearbook submissions:

Senior Portraits

Schedule your senior portrait to ensure proper delivery to the school. Senior portraits are due Friday, December 1. Failure to meet this deadline may result in an absence of a senior portrait. Please note that September 28, and 29, were picture days at the high school. This was the opportunity for students to get their photo taken (at no charge!) for identification cards. If you are unable to schedule a senior portrait, plan on using these days or November 8, (our retake day) as an opportunity to get a senior photo. Seniors need to get their photo taken on these dates to receive an ID card. No costumes or props will be allowed for photos.

Portrait Requirements

Senior Portraits must be submitted electronically (CD, email jpeg, USB). The digital image must be a resolution of 300 dpi and the color mode must be RGB. The image should be sized to a 5x7 image to ensure proper clarity. The yearbook is an all-color book so please plan accordingly when choosing a photo for the yearbook. To maintain a consistent look, only head and shoulders will be in the yearbook photo. No costumes or props will be allowed for photos. Photos submitted should be in color and with a simple background. The SVHS yearbook reserves the right to refuse a photo not meeting specifications.

Senior portraits are due Friday, December 1.

All electronic submissions are to be sent to dzietz@svsabers.org. If submitting in person, please see Mr. Zietz in room 22. Any picture received after the due dates listed are not guaranteed to be in the yearbook. It is the student's responsibility to check with their studio to see if the studio has submitted the senior portrait to Susquehanna Valley. Portraits from Sean Murphy Studios will automatically be sent to the school.
